How to Use *The Mental Measurements Yearbook*

The Mental Measurements Yearbooks (MMY) contain reviews and descriptions of English-language commercially published tests. The MMY series is cumulative; later volumes do not replace earlier ones. Tests in Print can be used as a comprehensive index to the contents of previously published MMYs.

1. If you know the TEST TITLE:

Use the "Index of Titles." The index lists all the titles included in the volume, and also includes cross-reference information useful for tests with superseded or alternative titles. (See also the "Index of Acronyms" as some tests are better known by their acronyms than their full titles.) *Citation numbers refer to entry numbers, not to page numbers.* An (N) indicates the test is a new, recently published test; an (R) indicates it has been revised or supplemented since its last appearance in an MMY.

2. If you know the TYPE OF TEST:

Use the "Classified Subject Index" to locate various categories of tests, such as achievement, intelligence, personality, etc. This index organizes all tests into 18 major categories; tests appear alphabetically within each category. Also listed is the population for which the test is intended. *Citation numbers refer to entry numbers, not to page numbers.*

3. If you know the NAME OF THE TEST AUTHOR OR REVIEWER:

Use the "Index of Names." This index includes test authors (for example, "test, 284"), review authors ("rev, 68"), and authors of referenced articles ("ref, 353"). *Citation numbers refer to entry numbers, not to page numbers.* (Parenthesized numbers indicate the reference number; "r" indicates an unnumbered reference cited by the reviewer.)
