

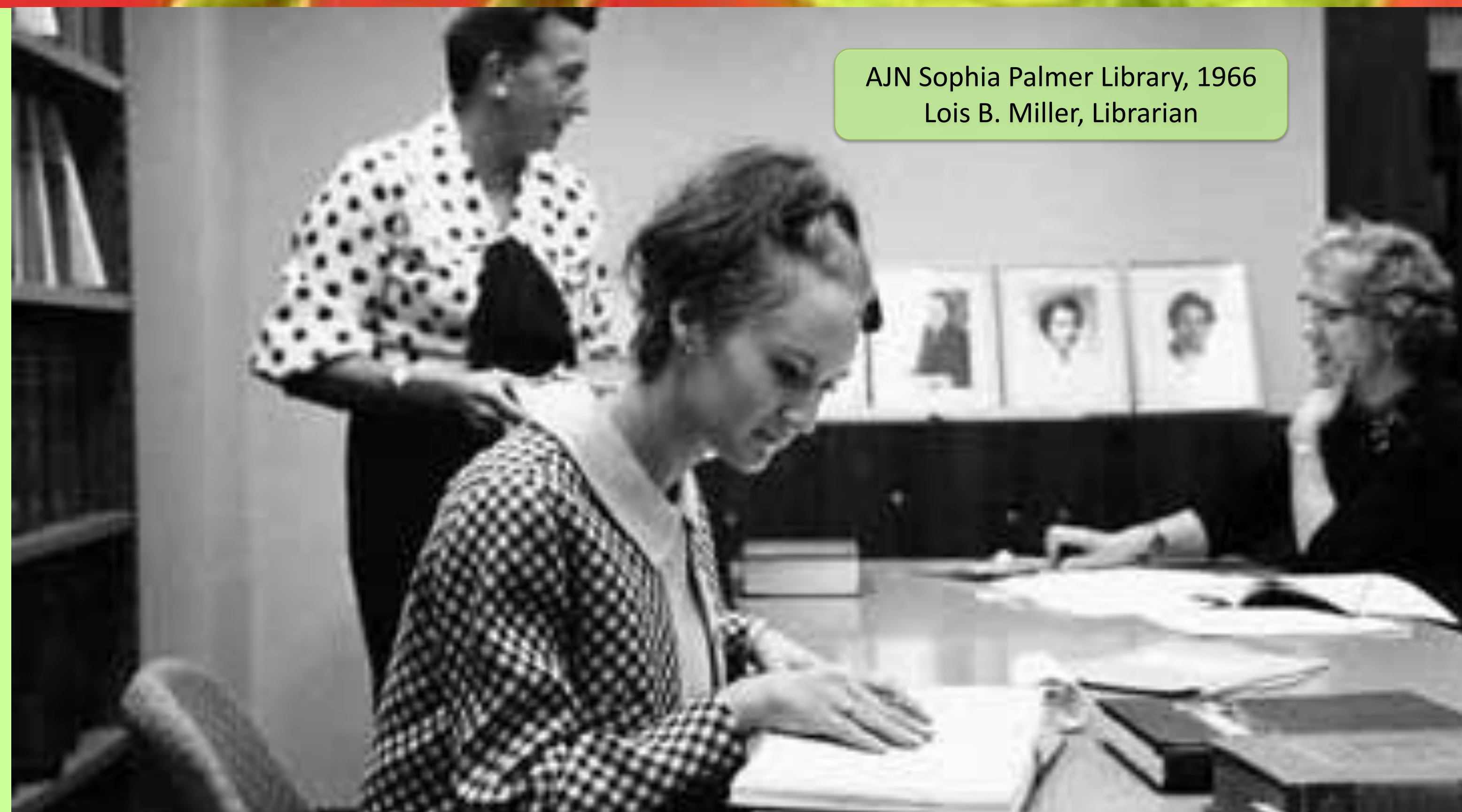

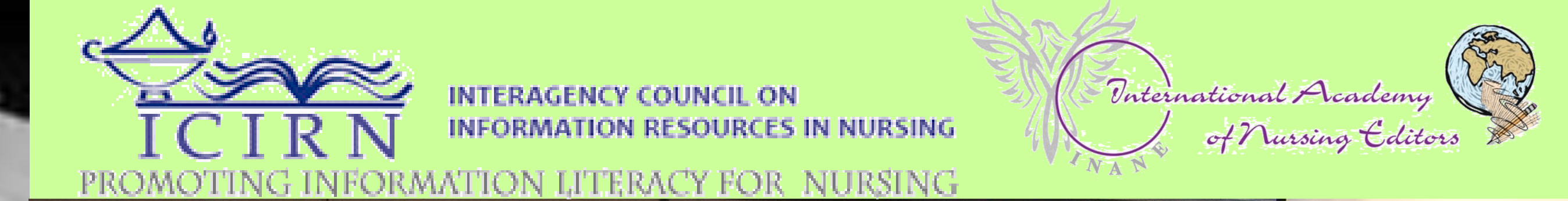


NAHRS Firsts

- 1964: Lois Miller 1964-67, first MLA Board Member
- 1982: NAHRS newsletter published
- 1984: Strategic Planning Committee
- 1985: Publications Committee established
- 1987: first NAHRS button
- 1989: Honors and Research Committees

- 1993: Membership Directory published

- 1997: Jacqueline Picciano, NAHRS FMLA

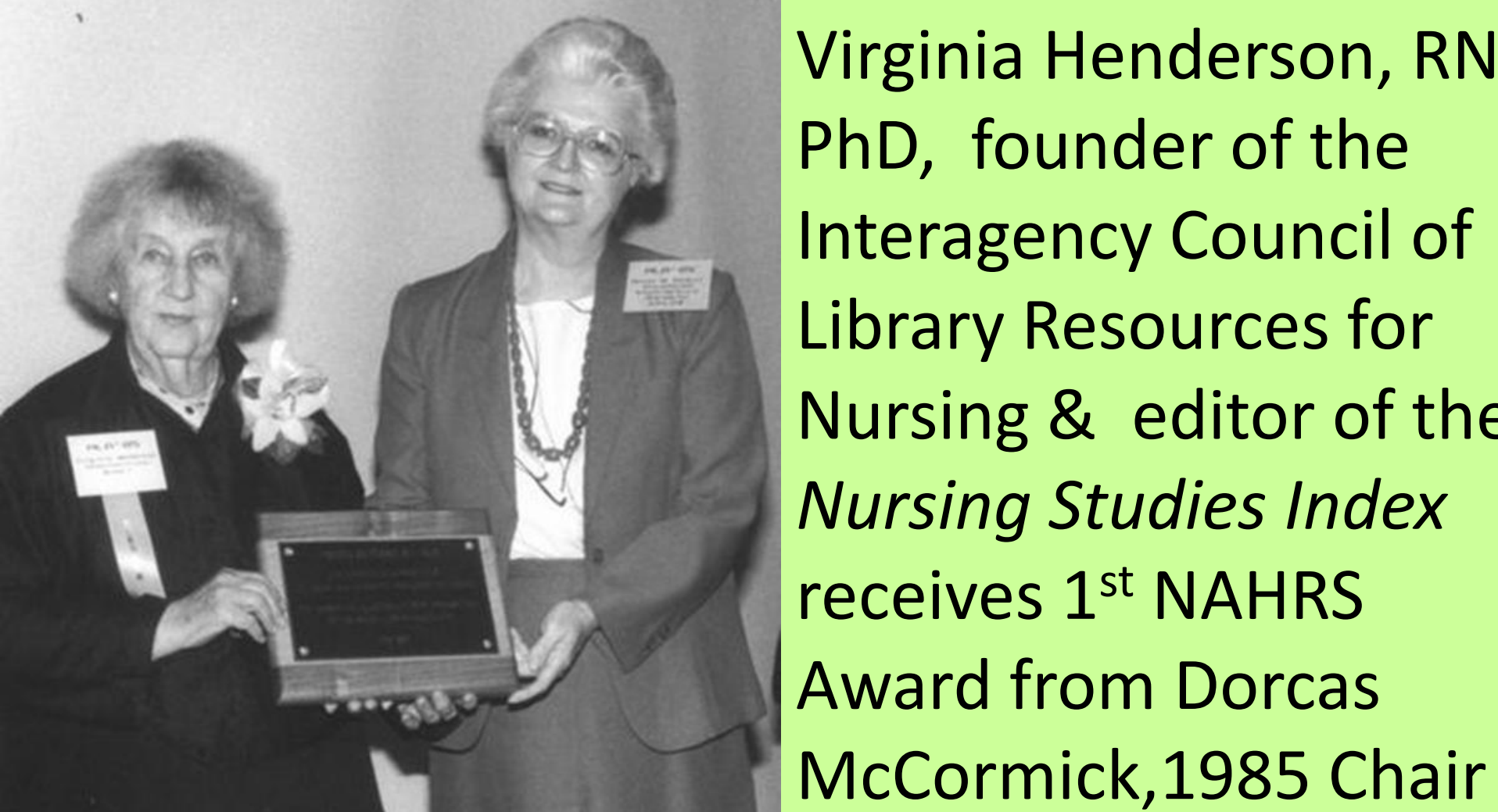
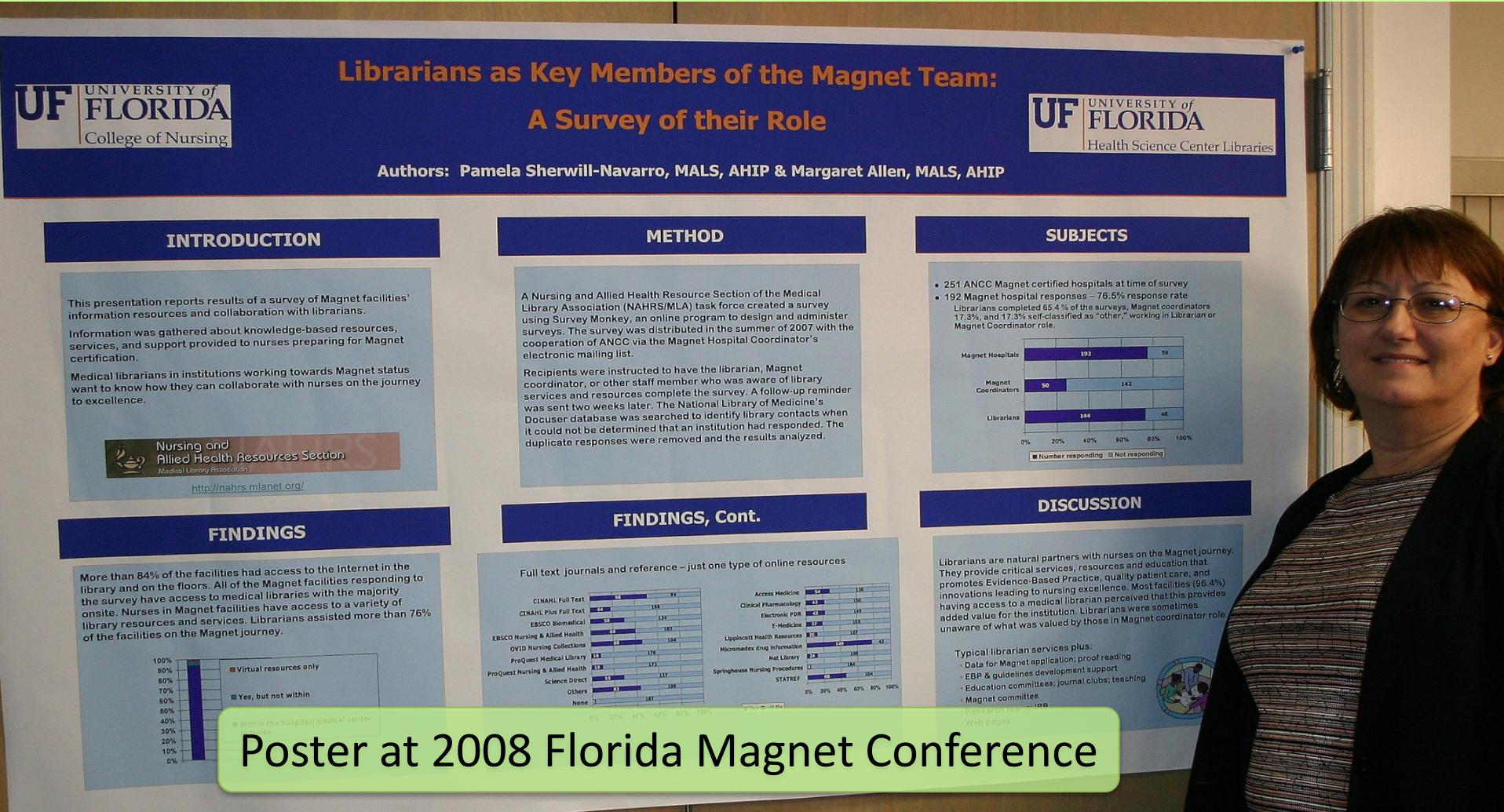
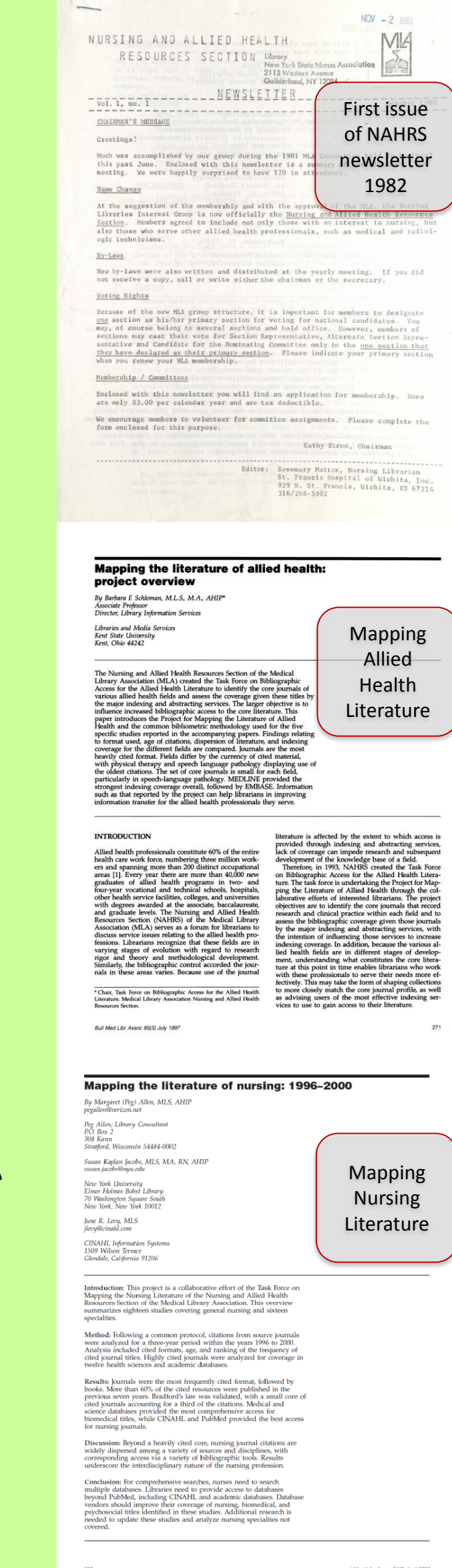
NAHRS History

- 1962: 11 librarians founded Nursing Group at MLA Annual Meeting, Chicago
- 1981: Name changed from Nursing Libraries Nursing Group to NAHRS; \$3 dues
- 1990: 160 members, \$10 dues
- 1993: 6th largest section in MLA
- 1996: 301 members, 73% increase since early 1990's
- 1997: Celebrated 35th anniversary with party, Historical Highlights scroll, and new gold pin
- 2012: 442 members; 2nd largest Section in MLA



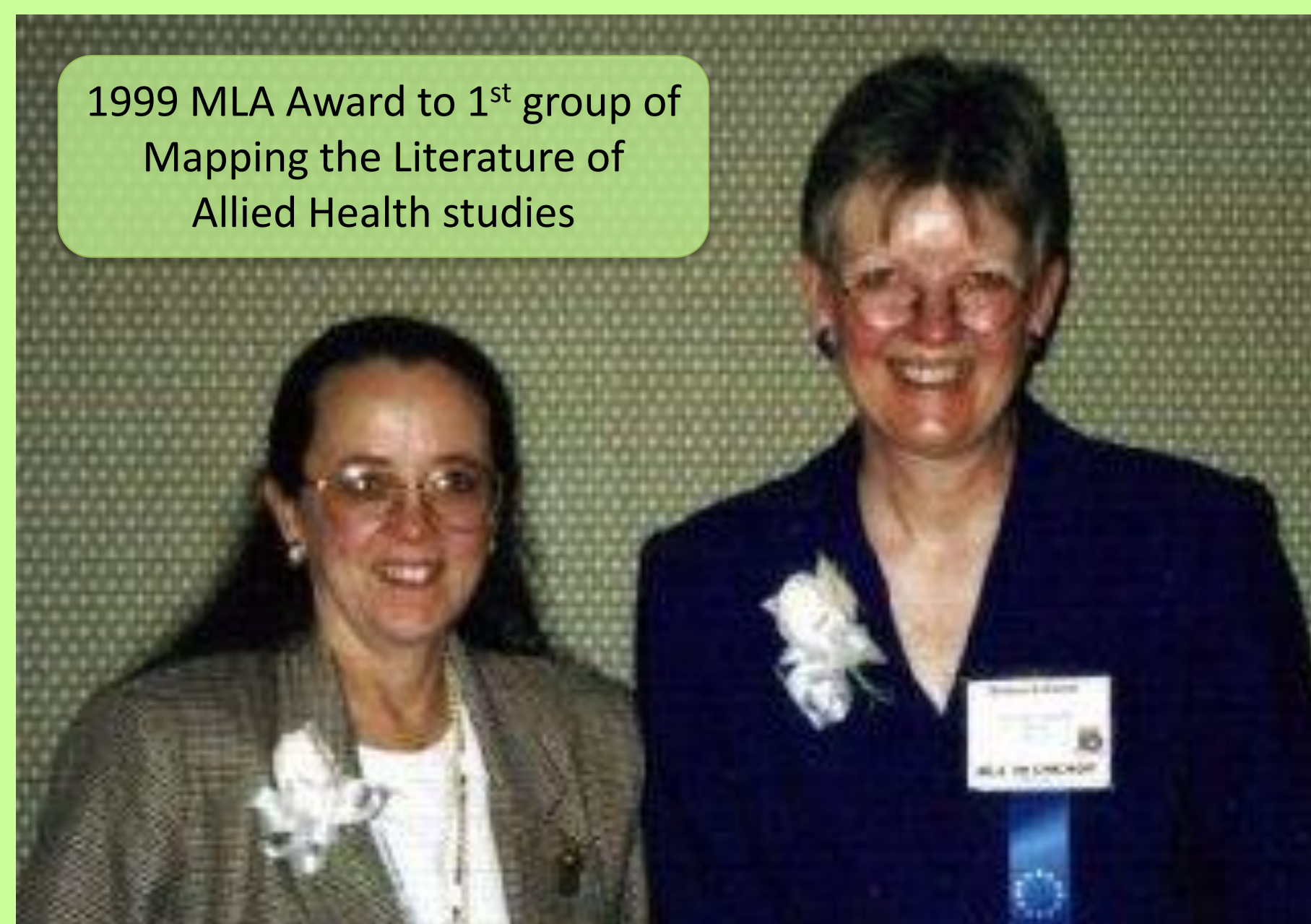
Program/CE Highlights

- 1975: Literature of Nursing an MLA CE course
- 1979: MLA CE literature of allied health offered for first time
- 1983: Began contributed papers nursing/allied health program at MLA meeting
- 2003: Sponsored Evidence-Based Practice Symposium at MLA
- 2006: ANCC Magnet Recognition and EBP programs, co-sponsored with HLS
