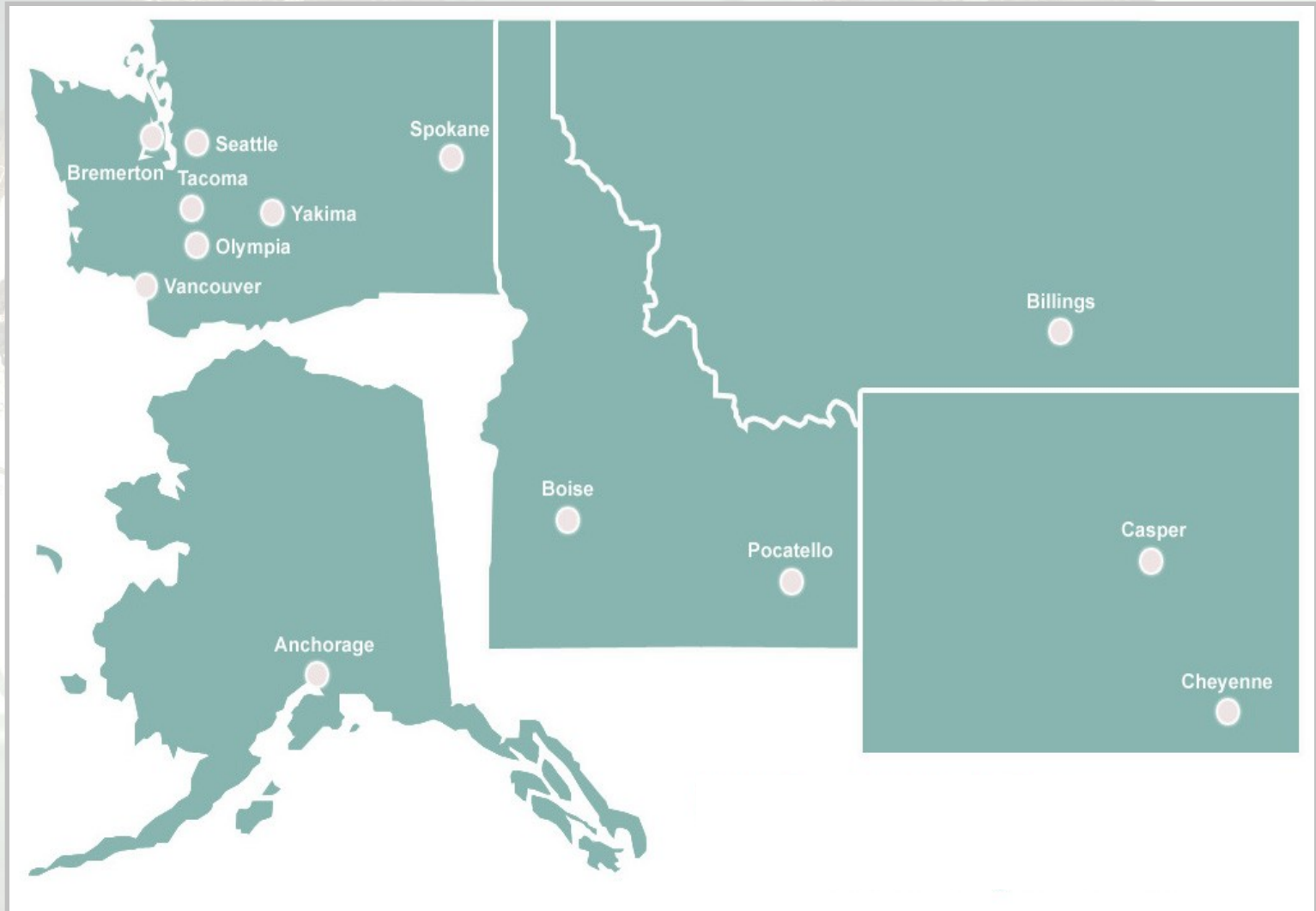

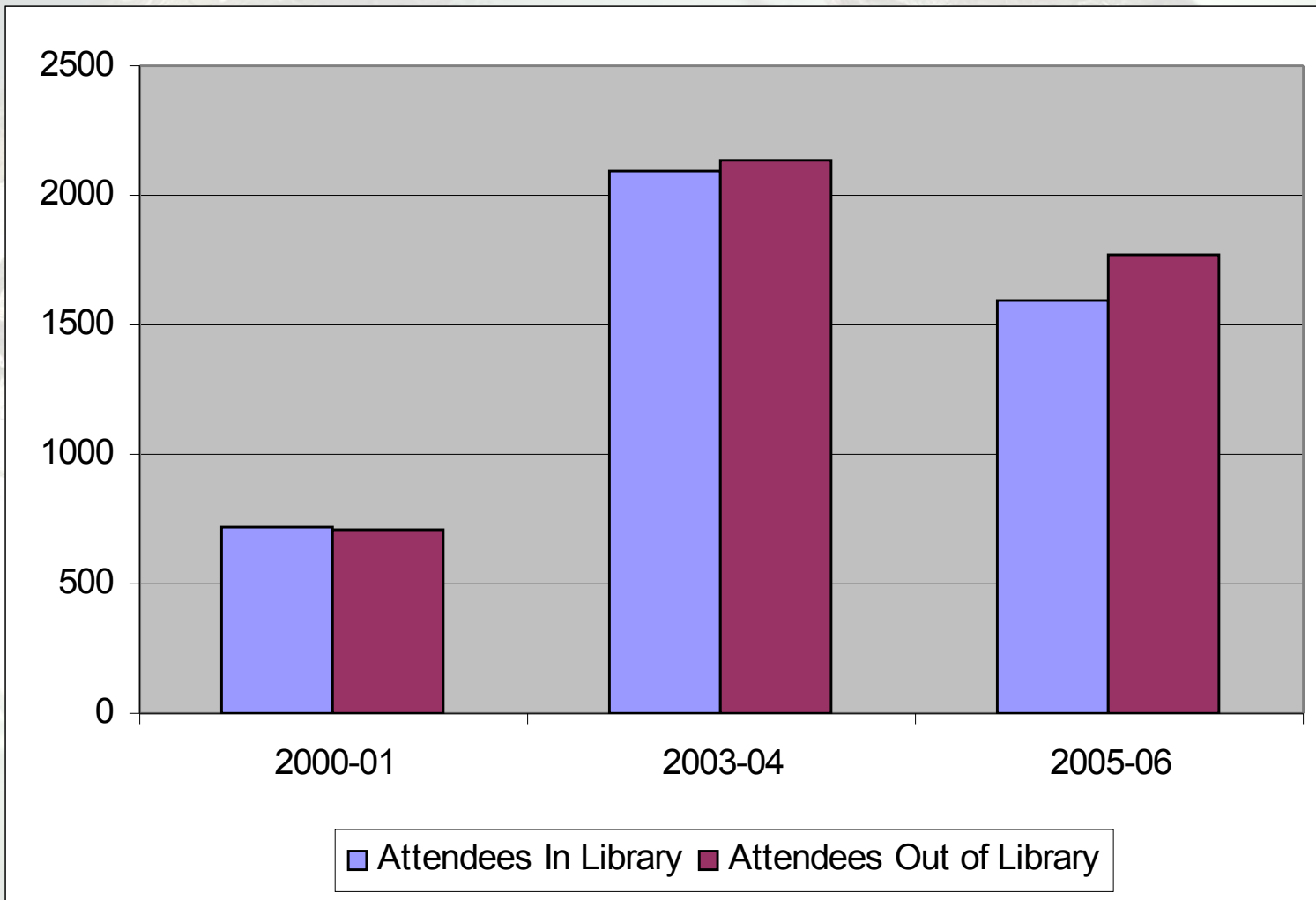

History of Services: Search Examples

- [Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature \(CINAHL\)](#) 

The CINAHL database can be searched for information about instruments using two fields: "Instrumentation" and "Document Type." See [CINAHL Search Tips](#) for more information about searching by field.

Instrumentation (IN)

Any article reporting a research study that used a particular instrument has the name of the instrument recorded in the Instrumentation field. Use the name of the instrument plus the two-letter abbreviation IN to search for studies that used a particular instrument.

Use the Change Display button, click on Complete Record, and then click on Confirm Changes to view the IN and all other fields in all records retrieved. Or click on View Complete Record at the end of each citation.

Document Type (DT)

[CINAHL](#) staff have created expanded records for approximately ninety instruments that are commonly used in nursing research studies. These expanded records include information such as original population, question format, administration, psychometrics, and information on how to obtain copies. Some of these also include the full-text of the instrument. To view the full text of the instrument, if available, click on the Change Display button, click on Complete Record, and then click on Confirm Changes. Or, click on View Complete Record at the end of each citation.

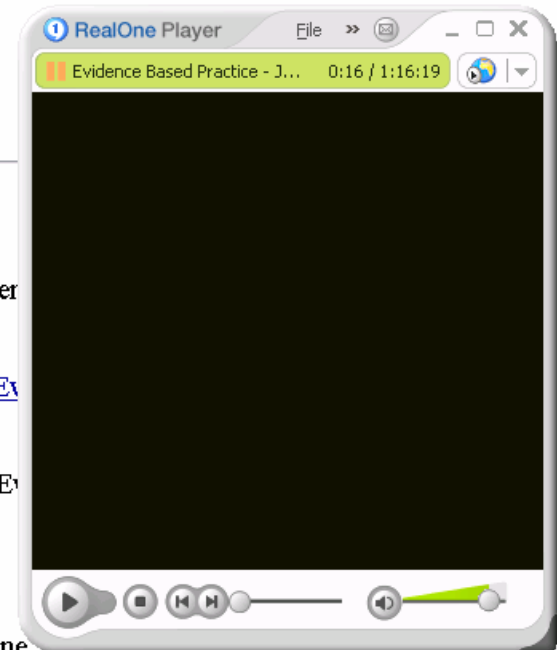

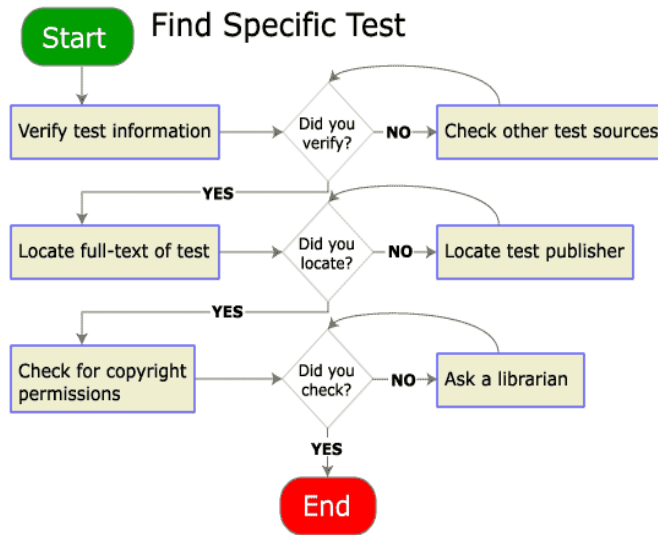
