


Locating Evidence-Based Pediatric Nutrition Resources on the Web

 - iii. Limit to Dietary Supplements under Filters>Choose additional Filters>Subjects
 - iv. PubMed at the UW libguide libguides.hsl.washington.edu/pubmed
 - v. Medline Complete with Full-Text available through HEALWA \$H

 - Systematic reviews of primary research in human health care and health policy that investigate
 the effects of interventions for prevention, treatment, and rehabilitation. Internationally
 recognized as the highest standard in evidence-based health care

 - i. Use Clinical Queries-Systematic Reviews section
 - ii. Select Meta-Analysis or Systematic Reviews as an Article Type filter
